



## Review of the educational and scientific program of the second (master's) level of higher education at Lviv National Music Academy named after M.V. Lysenko

The educational and scientific program "Musical Art" of the second (master's) level of higher education, which has been implemented since September 2020 at Lviv National Music Academy named after MV. Lysenko is worked out for 2 years of study and consists of 120 ECTS credits. It regulates the requirements for the level of education of persons who can start studying according to it, the list of disciplines and the logical sequence of studying them, as well as the expected learning outcomes that a Master's degree in Music must have.

The quality of training of modern teachers, scientists, musicians and musicologists depends on their integration into international content, involvement in world scientific, cultural and artistic processes. An important factor in this is close cooperation with educational institutions in Europe and the world, exchange with the best creative and educational ideas, participation in international educational and research projects.

The acquaintance of the Academy of Music in Tromsø with the training program for masters of music at Lviv National Academy of Music began during our participation in a joint international educational project «CPEurasia 2010-2014 – Call for Proposals 2011» Project number CPEA-2011/10053. There was an exchange of students between our educational institutions under the master's program during the implementation period of this project. Students from the Lviv National Academy of Music studied for a master's degree in Tromsø, and our students studied at Lviv National Academy of Music.

There were many exchanges with master classes between our and Lviv music professors, along with the students' education.

As a result of our cooperation, we can say that the Lviv National Academy of Music is a center of sustainable European traditions of professional music education, performance and creativity. And it continues these traditions in our time successfully.

The peer-reviewed master's degree program consists of compulsory and elective components. The mandatory component includes three cycles of disciplines: scientific and professional training, practical training and a cycle of professional training disciplines. The cycle of professional training disciplines is divided into 13 blocks, each of which is aimed at specific training in the chosen profile during the entrance: piano, violin, viola, cello, flute, clarinet, conducting, vocals, composition, musicology and others. The elective component of the educational program consists of general development disciplines that are not directly related to the speciality.

Also, the elective component of the educational program includes cycles of disciplines for additional qualifications.

Material and technical resources, in particular the library fund, musical instruments, auditoriums and concert halls, various information and technical equipment contribute to the goals set in the educational and scientific program. The content of the program determines the full training of students in all cycles of the proposed disciplines, and training in this program contributes to the education of highly qualified professionals in the field of music.

Given the above, we believe that the peer-reviewed educational and scientific master's program at Lviv National Music Academy named after MV. Lysenko meets modern requirements for professionals of this level and deserves a positive assessment.
